## Laying the Foundation Warm-Up / Presentation



Actions		Materials
S	Ask students to look out the window and describe what they ee. Ask questions so they focus on nature, such as:  What has green leaves? (trees)  What's over the ground? (grass or lawn)  How many students live in an apartment or a house?  Who takes care of the lawn? flowers? etc.?	
T	Ask students about lawn care in their country:  Who does it?  What tools are used?  Tell students that today they will learn about lawn care and dentify nine steps to care for a lawn.	
la b h	Using the Lawn Care Picture Story (either on an overhead or arge versions of each frame), introduce each frame of the story by asking learners to describe the picture and predict what is appening. For example, ask questions such as:  Where is the man? (outside, at a house, on the lawn)  What's his job? (landscaper, lawn care, grass cutter)  What's he doing? (varies by picture; see Steps to Lawn Care Script)  What tools or equipment is he using? (varies by picture)  Write elicited vocabulary, descriptions and lawn care steps on the board, overhead, or flip chart paper.  Show each picture of the story again. As you show the picture, the ead the lawn care step associated with it from the Steps to Lawn Care Script; i.e. show Frame #1 and read Step #1, etc. ask learners how well their predictions matched the actual tory. 4.	Hand out a copy of the Lawn Care Picture Story and the Steps to Lawn Care Script Handout. While you read the Steps to Lawn Care Script, the students follow along with their copy of the Steps to Lawn Care Handout and/or their copy of the Lawn Care Picture Story. Distribute <b>Vocabulary Handout B</b> . Students choose the best definition for the word by matching the word and definition. Complete the first vocabulary word together. If students finish early, they can put the words in alphabetical order and/or also complete <b>Handout A</b> .

Easy: The Handout A. As the teacher reads, the students fill in the blanks.	Multilevel Dictation Handout B
Difficult:	Blank Paper
Distribute <b>Multilevel Dictation Handout B</b> . As you read, the students fill in the blanks. If students finish early, they can listen again and write the entire sentence for each step on a blank piece of paper.	
During the dictation, you should circulate and assess comprehension. Dictate the <b>Steps</b> multiple times to provide sufficient opportunity for students to understand (e.g., 3 times).	
Show the <b>Steps to Lawn Care</b> on the overhead and/or ask higher level students to write them on the board for a whole-group correction.	

## Finishing Work Extension or Out-of-Class Practice




Actions		Materials
1.	Pair students for a student-to-student dictation of the <b>Steps to Lawn Care.</b> One student reads the steps while the other listens and writes.	Steps to Lawn Care Script
2.	Students write a conversation using one (or more) frame of the <b>Lawn Care Picture Story.</b>	Lawn Care Picture Story
3.	Discuss adverbs and encourage students to use the adverbs from this lesson in a new sentence.	Lawn Care Step Picture Cards
4.	Using the Lawn Care Step Picture Cards and/or Steps to Lawn Care Strips, play charades. Mix up the Cards and/or Strips. Place the cards face down on the table. Ask each student to draw one card and act out the action without using words. The other students guess what the student is doing by calling out the step, e.g., "Water deeply." 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

#### Activity #1: Steps to Lawn Care Script

Step 1: Rake leaves and debris.

Step 2: Level high or low spots.

Step 3: Test the soil.

Step 4: Cultivate the right grass.

Step 5: Water deeply.

Step 6: Check the lawnmower. Adjust the blade carefully. Put on safety gear.

Step 7: Mow the grass to the proper height. Use a sharp blade.

Step 8: Inspect thoroughly for disease, insects, and weeds.

Step 9: Apply fertilizer and pesticides evenly.

Rake leaves and debris.

Level high or low spots.

Test the soil.

**Cultivate the right grass.** 

Water deeply.

Check the mower. Adjust the blade carefully. Put on safety gear.

Mow the grass to the proper height. Use a sharp blade.

Inspect thoroughly for disease, insects, and weeds.

Apply fertilizer and pesticides evenly.

- 4. Cultivate the right grass.

Adjust the <u>blade</u> carefully.

Put on safety gear.
