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# Meeting the Challenge: An LD Primer

#### Part 1: What is LD and How Does it Affect My Learners?

**Description:** Join Rochelle Kenyon as she explores the basics of learning disabilities (LD) and explains ways to identify individuals who are undiagnosed but exhibit characteristics which affect their learning. Also learn about a free LD screening tool. Individuals will be able to ask questions about adults with learning disabilities.

- Explain how an information-processing deficit affects learning.
- Explain the three core components of a learning disability.
- Identify characteristics that may signify an undiagnosed learning disability.
- Explain the process of screening for suspected learning disabilities.
- Explain why LD screening tools are important for teachers and tutors with students that are suspected of having learning disabilities.
- List several LD screening tools that are available for use.
- Administer a free LD screening tool with a student.

#### Part 2: Instructional and Learning Strategies

**Description:** During part 2 of the training, the discussion will focus on creating an environment where students with learning disabilities will be successful, exploring research-based instructional strategies and techniques, and teaching students how to use learning strategies.

- List ways teachers/tutors can make instructional adaptations and accommodations.
