

FIRST LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

Immigrants are faced with economic and cultural adjustments when they arrive in the United States. Learning English is a major task that faces them. On average, it takes immigrants six years to be able to accomplish most of the normal English language communication tasks required of them.

FLORIDA STATISTICS

Over 1.5 million of Florida's residents speak little or no English, making it difficult to access information that can assist them in everyday survival skills such as obtaining a driver's license, filling out a tax return, or knowing where to locate specific social services and recreational opportunities.

There is not enough space in programs to serve everyone who wants to learn English. Most cities have waiting lists of several months to several years, and some rural areas have no available classes.

In 1999, there were 115, 535 Florida adults enrolled in English for Limited English Proficient Adults programs and 3,980 adults in Citizenship classes.

Florida has a larger non-English speaking population than all states except California, Texas, and New York. Demographic changes in ethnicity within the state have been amplified in the public school population. Among ethnic groups, the most dramatic growth has occurred with Florida's Hispanic population of students which increased from 99,241 in 1976 to 612,985 in 2001.

Students enrolled in the K-12 Limited English Proficiency Program in 2001-02 numbered 204,236. During the October 2002 Survey Week in Florida school districts, there were 146,602 students from Grades 1-12 enrolled in ESOL classes.

Florida is projected to rank 3rd among all states in the number of arriving foreign immigrants during the next quarter century. The projected gain for Florida by 2025 is 1.9 million. **SOURCE:** Change, and Response to Change in Florida's Public Schools 2002.
