FLORIDA LITERACY COALITION RECOGNIZES POLK COUNTY RESIDENT WITH LEADERSHIP AWARD

ORLANDO, Florida (May 21, 2010) – The <u>Florida Literacy Coalition</u> recently recognized Margaret Anne Wheeler with its Mary J. Brogan Leadership Award for exhibiting the highest standards of excellence, dedication, creativity and accomplishment in literacy efforts. The award was presented at a special banquet held during the annual <u>Florida</u> <u>Literacy Conference</u> in Captiva, Fla.

In all, six awards were presented during the State Literacy Awards banquet. Nominated by READ Polk, Wheeler has acquired a reputation as Polk County's "literacy queen." For the past two decades, Wheeler has been at the heart of the county's literacy network. Her leadership roles have included teaching, administrating and acting as a role model to expand adult literacy efforts in the county.

Wheeler initiated literacy programs in Lakeland's tri-county area workplaces in the 1990s which resulted in thousands of adult students enrolling in local literacy programs. She co-founded READ Polk, the county's coordinating council of adult and family literacy programs, and is a ProLiteracy certified master trainer. Currently employed as the community involvement coordinator for Polk County Public Schools, Wheeler supervises 30,000 intergenerational volunteers and serves on the Florida Education Commissioner's Community Involvement Council.
